Commander Van Landuyt reviewed the OPP Chatsworth Services Board Reports for the months of August and September, 2009. The Commander noted on an incident that was not in the report. It was on an overtime item where there was a sexual assault in Holland Township on a 2 year old girl by her baby sitters son, a 14 year old boy on August 11, 2009. The boy is being treated so as to hopefully correct his behavior so he will not act in such a manner again.

The incident on August 12<sup>th</sup> was brought to the attention of the board to note that the accused has been arrested and charged.

The August 13<sup>th</sup> incident resulted in many drug related charges after a raid in Sullivan Township.

The Commander also noted that on August 16 there was a gathering where a 29 year old male attended and was not welcome. He was walking down the road when a vehicle came up and stopped and the people in the car got out and assaulted the male but did not rob him. It has been treated as an assault on the male himself and not just a random act.

Commander Van Landuyt also noted on the incident on August 23<sup>rd</sup> that involved an out of control youth at Pine Hill Youth Center.

The Board members questioned the incident on September 5<sup>th</sup> where Walter Subject was charged with liquor offenses and wanted to know when he would go to court. The Commander noted that it usually takes between 6 and 7 weeks between charges and court dates.

The incident on Sept 18<sup>th</sup> involved overtime and the Commander wanted to make a note of that.

The Commander wanted to make mention on the Personnel Issues and welcomed the new recruits that started in September.

The financial situation was noted next and the overtime hours in which there was 2.5 hours for cattle fraud. It was four times the amount of overtime hours but it is divided amongst all the other detachments and the province as it was a wide spread case. The hours that were shown as robbery hours were actually assault hours.

Some other items Commander Van Landuyt noted on where that collisions were up slightly, hours were also up. He also noted that seatbelt enforcement was down but last year there were two campaigns and only one this year.

### **New Business**

The board members asked Commander Mark Van Landuyt when he starts at his new detachment; he advised them that he had already started on October 13<sup>th</sup>. The chair expressed a heartfelt thank you and appreciation to Mark for his work and presented him with a gift from the Chatsworth Police Services Board.

On behalf of the Council of the Township of Chatsworth, Cornelius Vlieland also presented Commander Van Landuyt with a gift of appreciation. The Commander thanked everyone for their support and gave his wishes for a good relationship with the new Inspector who is coming in from Queens Park.
