Crime Unit

Supervisor: Detective Sergeant Byron SCHWASS

The Grey Bruce County Crime Unit (6 Detectives) led, assisted or managed 66 Benchmark Occurrences September 1st, to October 31st 2021.

This includes one multijurisdictional homicide, 11 Sudden Death investigations (two of which were opiate overdoses), 10 sexual assaults, six Criminal Harassment investigations, two in depth Missing Person cases (both resolved with the person found alive) as well as assisting other Major Crime Units with investigations/statements, and providing guidance to uniform personnel on criminal investigations.

The Grey Bruce Major Crime Unit continues to follow up leads, prepare for court, and investigate several ongoing Homicides which fall under the direction of OPP Criminal Investigations Branch (CIB).

- SPRUNG Homicide (Meaford) completed the preliminary inquiry for 1st degree Murder
- SOLOMON Homicide (Saugeen First Nation) court pending
- JACKSON attempt murder (North Bruce Peninsula)
- CHISAR homicide (male arrested for 2nd degree Murder). *D/Sgt and 2 DCs currently partnered with Hamilton Police Service on this. (Found Human Remains, Southgate)
- The Christina YADRAM First degree Murder investigation commenced on the 10th of October 2021 near Tobermory. 1 male arrested and charged.



The Nolan PANCHYSHYN homicide has resulted in a Plea to Manslaughter (04 Oct 2021)

All National and Ontario Sex Offenders, Hate Crime / Extremism Investigations and High Risk to re-offend Offenders and High Risk Domestic Violence Offenders continue to be managed by the Grey Bruce County Crime Unit.

Community Street Crime Unit

Supervisor: Detective Sergeant James BLAIR

The local Community Street Crime Unit (CSCU) is comprised of members from two detachments in the area. Grey Bruce OPP currently provides 3 Detective Constables and South Bruce OPP provides 2 Detective Constables.

The Community Street Crime Unit (CSCU) is designed to tackle community level drug and property crime occurrences. The success of the CSCU Program is based on the fact that members have an intimate knowledge of the issues facing the communities they serve while enjoying strong relationships with both their fellow detachment members and members of the Organized Crime Enforcement Bureau. The unit also works jointly with our municipal policing partners in the area.

The CSCU Program strengthens the OPP's commitment to ensuring public safety and delivering proactive and innovative policing. It also presents an exciting development opportunity for our frontline members. Members chosen as CSCU officers target the illicit drug trade and property crimes within their respective detachment area. These officers receive training and gain extensive experience in complex case law, search warrant preparation, processing of exhibits, preparation of court briefs, operational plans and other applicable reports associated to community crime investigations. Furthermore CSCU officers receive specialized training in relation to Controlled Drugs and Substances, surveillance, search warrant execution, firearms and Intelligence gathering.

There has been a number of challenges for the unit in 2021 as we have had 3 senior Detectives in the CSCU that have moved on to new opportunities and we are in the process of developing and training new members to fill this void. During the month of October the CSCU Detectives in Grey Bruce Detachment have 14 ongoing investigations within the detachment area.



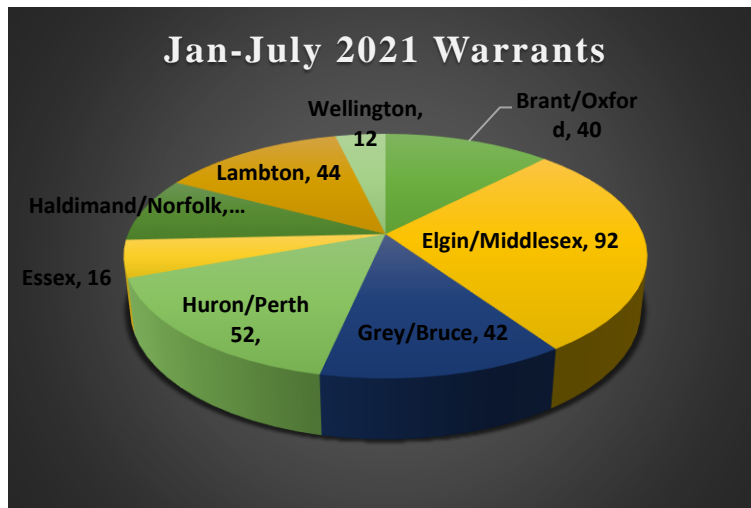

West Region CSCU Search Warrants 2021 & 2020 Reviews

A comparison of the number of search warrants executed by the 8 CSCU units in West Region shows the success we are having in Grey Bruce.



From January until July 2021 Grey Bruce CSCU was third of eight teams in the number of search warrants that the unit had executed. We were only below Elgin-Middlesex and Huron-Perth.

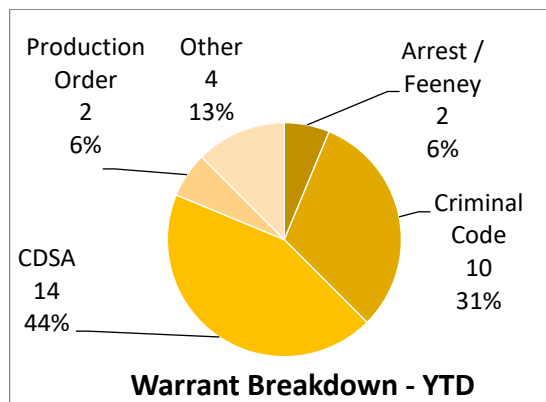
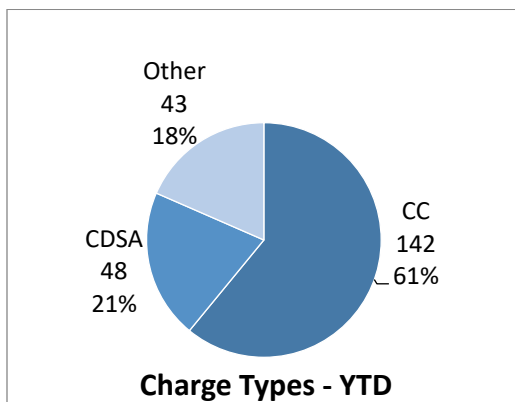


In 2020, Grey Bruce CSCU had the second highest number of search warrants executed in West Region. Considering our smaller rural area was compared with large urban centers such as Essex and Wellington this is testament to the hard work and devotion of the Detectives assigned to our local CSCU.

As the charts above illustrate, this year CSCU members from Grey-Bruce have investigated 53 occurrences, charged 51 people with 233 criminal code or CDSA charges, executed 32 search warrants, 17 of which involved warrant service entry. Despite more than half the unit being relatively new to these types of investigations the unit is on track to meet the results we achieved in 2020.

The following are October/ November Updates in Grey Bruce:

- CSCU members met with Grey County Housing in relation to on-going drug use/trafficking at Victoria Village, Meaford.
- CSCU members assisted with a Child Sexual Exploitation Unit investigation.
- CSCU members have been working in conjunction with our West Region Analyst and Intelligence Unit in relation to the increase in stolen vehicles in Grey-Bruce over the last 2 months. D/C Starzecki has taken the lead on coordinating this investigation.
- The team was part of the OCEB lead Project Gainsborough take down. This involved 14 Search Warrants executed in London, Hamilton, St. Thomas and the GTA. CSCU Grey-Bruce was assigned a search warrant in the London area. This project resulted in the seizure of 32 million in illegal drugs and contraband. A total of 21 members or associates of a criminal organization have been arrested and charged with 118 offences under the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act (CDSA), Cannabis Act and Criminal Code, including charges related to organized crime.
- CSCU assisted Major Crime and ERT with the apprehension of a wanted male who is retired from the Military and known to have MHA-PTSD issues. The male was located and apprehended without incident.
- CSCU executed a General Warrant in Chatsworth Twp for stolen goods. No stolen property present at the time of the warrant execution.
- CSCU also assisted front line member with writing warrant in follow-up to recovered stolen vehicle. Believed to be connected with other vehicle thefts in the area.
- CSCU executed a CDSA warrant at 119 Sussex Square, Georgian Bluffs – Quantities of cocaine, meth and fentanyl seized. 4 persons arrested and charged with 9 offences. Vehicle seized and to be search pending warrant.

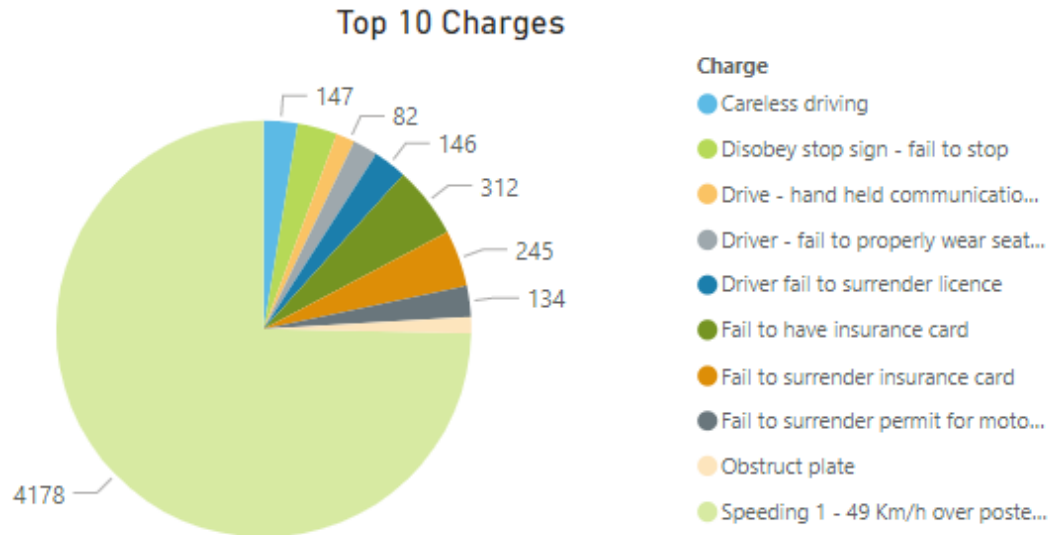

Top 10 Charges in West Region in September & October

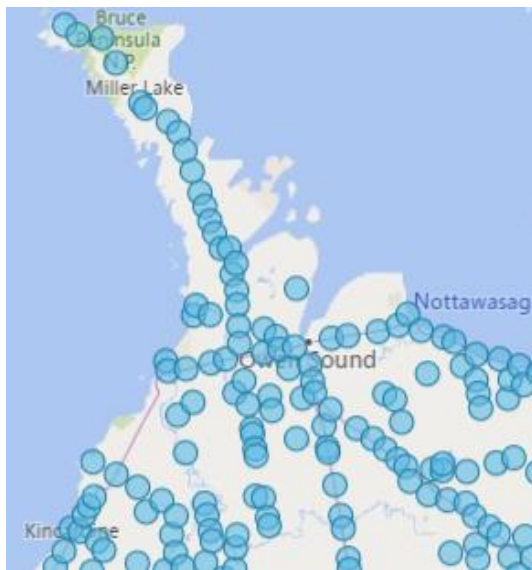




Traffic Violations in Chatsworth

- Participated in several committees including Safe Communities, and Regional Road Safety
- Liaised and met with members at regional headquarters regarding implementing the “Finding Your Way” Alzheimer’s program at detachment level – on going
- Attended round table meeting for at risk youth living in Meaford
- Completed two youth YMCA Justice diversions regarding Cannabis Control Act Charges
- Prepared OPP swag and items for elementary school who was preparing kindergarten orientation packages
- Followed up with members of the public and implemented plans to address speeding concerns north of Wiarton
- Liaised with a community group looking to start a neighborhood watch program. Resources provided regarding the program
- Attended community supports committee meeting to discuss communication tools for providing police with information regarding high risk clients within communities.
- Responded to a suicide in progress call. Deescalated situation, confirmed well-being of individual and engaged community resources to provide help
- Address concerns from member of the public regarding high school students during their break. Proactive patrol plan created and enacted to assess the situation further
- Attended and de-escalated a mental health patient from a local hospital that had run away. Worked with hospital staff to engage a safe plan, patient safely and willingly returned for treatment.

November 2021

- Assisted with calls for service throughout Grey Bruce County
- Coordinated with several municipalities for police participation in Santa Clause parades.
- Conducted lock down drills at schools within Grey Bruce.
- Met with Safe Communities and Regional Road Safety Committees to continue Grey Bruce’s commitment to improving road safety.
- Completed training and reviewed schools for bus patrol training.
- Attended the delivery of Grey Highlands Stunt driving sign, purchased by the Grey Highlands Police Service Board.
- Assisted road officers with collisions due to extreme weather.
- Presented high risk individuals to the Grey Bruce Situation Table to coordinate a partnered response to aid those individuals in getting help the need.



- Provided police input to Grey Bruce Child and Family Services for ongoing investigations they are conducting.
- Presented to several grade 7/8 classes and high school classes about drugs, alcohol and tobacco.
- Liaised with several communities about neighborhood watch programs.
- Attended Community Support Meetings to talk about police involvement with high risk community living clients. As a result, future training sessions will be provided to Grey Bruce OPP.
- Assisted with diversion programs for several incidents involving rugs and students. Liaised with families to allow students to participate in diversion programs about their high risk behavior.
- Continued involvement with the Project Lifesaver program.
- Assisted several stranded students after their bus had slid into a ditch. Worked with parents, the bus company, and tow companies to ensure safe arrival of student to their homes and safe removal of the school bus.
